## **OVERVIEW**

## Autumn in Tuscany in magic.

The new wine is in the barrels, the vineyards have turned to muted yellows and soft reds, the olives are ready for harvest. The light is soft over the rolling hills. We think this is the best time to explore Tuscany's hilltop villages, spectacular countryside, and most beautiful urban centres.

We spend six nights in a comfortable restored convent hotel in the heart of Siena – it's a special luxury to be here when the day trippers have left – and three nights in a historic monastery inn in Florence. Days are spent visiting the abbeys, Renaissance towns, and loveliest piazzas, tasting wine at the estates, and lingering in village markets. Evenings are enjoyed over stimulating conversation in traditional trattorias.

Study leader Michael Treschow adds a special context and understanding to our Tuscan sojourn with stimulating presentations on the medieval and the Renaissance and the art and literature that flowered in those times. If you delight in a slow travel and rich experiences, in exquisite landscapes, and great architecture, join us in Tuscany this fall.

## **DAILY ITINERARY**

## Saturday, Oct. 14: Arrive Florence, Drive to Siena

Please plan to arrive in Florence by 2:00PM today. A specific meeting time and place at the Florence Airport. Then, set off by coach south to Siena for a six-night stay in a lovely convent hotel. Enjoy an orientation walk to the scallop-shaped Piazza del Campo, one of the most beautiful urban spaces in the world within the most extensive spread of medieval townscape anywhere. Linger over our welcome dinner this evening.

## Sunday, Oct. 15: Siena

Michael Treschow's morning seminar will introduce Siena as the home of St. Catherine, an outspoken and politically active Dominican, one of the first women to be named a Doctor of the Church. Then set off to visit the Basilica of San Domenico; the Cappella di Santa Caterina is decorated with frescoes depicting her life. Visit the former home of St. Catherine where she, her parents and 24 siblings lived; the rooms were converted into small chapels in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. Visit the Duomo, a dazzling cathedral built with white and green marble, and housing spectacular medieval and Renaissance works of art.

## Monday, Oct. 16: Excursion to Abbey Saint Antimo, Montalcino, Pienza

Drive south through the super-scenic rolling countryside of the Crete Senesi. The starkly beautiful landscape is dotted with isolated stone farmhouses and cypress trees. Visit Pienza, a planned city built in the 1460s in accordance with Renaissance principles at the behest of Pope Pius II. Enjoy lunch on the estate of a Brunello di Montalcino wine producer then explore the medieval streets of the walled town, dominated by its 14<sup>th</sup> century fortress. In an isolated, peaceful valley nearby, visit the lovely Romanesque Abbey of Sant' Antimo.

Tuesday, Oct. 17: Siena

Michael's morning seminar will discuss the Gothic style in Siena's art and architecture. The 14<sup>th</sup> century Palazzo Buonsignori houses the Pinacoteca Nazionale with its extraordinary collection of Gothic masterpieces. Magnificent works by Duccio, Simone Martini and Pietro Lorenzetti will be the focus of our visit this morning. Siena's Palazzo Pubblico is one of the finest examples of Gothic secular architecture. Inside, admire rooms richly frescoed by Sienese artists. Overnight: Albergo Alma Domus

## Wednesday, Oct. 18: Excursion to Volterra & San Gimignano

A wonderful drive through the Tuscan hills to Volterra, almost wholly embraced by its medieval walls. Explore the winding cobblestone streets of the well-preserved centre; visit the 12<sup>th</sup> century Cathedral with its handsome coffered ceiling,

the Baptistry, and the Roman Theatre dating from the first century B.C. Stop for a light lunch and wine and olive oil tasting in the countryside. This afternoon, when the day trippers have departed, discover the extraordinary medieval streetscape of San Gimignano with its fourteen 13<sup>th</sup> century hundred-foot stone towers.

## Thursday, Oct. 19: Siena

Michael's morning seminar will discuss the social and political history of Siena and Florence, highlighting the Black Death and factional strife, with the added question as how Florence rose do ascendency during the Renaissance. The rest of the day is at leisure to explore your favourite part of the city. Share your discoveries over dinner this evening.

## Friday, Oct. 20: Drive to Florence

Set off north into the Chianti hills to visit Brolio Castle in the hands of the Ricasoli family since 1141 and the medieval village of Radda in Chianti situated on a hill covered with woods and extensive vineyards. Light lunch and wine tasting at the Querceto estate, producers of Chianti Classico with over 50 hectares of vineyards.

### Saturday, Oct. 21: Florence

Michael's morning seminar will discuss Dante and his most famous work the Divine Comedy. We'll look at some of the Florentine characters that he places in Hell, Purgatory, and Heaven. Our guided walk follows Dante's path though the city, exploring the places that inspired *The Divine Comedy*. Starting at the Baptistery where Dante himself was baptized, we'll delve deep into the heart of medieval Florence to visit Dante's home and the church where he met Beatrice, his muse.

## Sunday, Oct. 22: Florence

Our guided walk this morning will focus on the city's Renaissance period, winding our way through the narrow alleys of the compact city centre and visiting a number of 15<sup>th</sup> century churches and palaces. The afternoon is free for independent exploration before our celebratory dinner this evening. Overnight: Hotel Loggiato Dei Serviti or similar

Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

## Monday, Oct. 23: Depart Florence

This morning we transfer to the airport for homeward bound flights or to the train station for optional extensions to Rome or Venice. Please enquire about itineraries for extensions. *Meals: Breakfast*

## **Joining Instructions**

This tour begins with a group meeting at the Florence Airport at 2PM on October 14<sup>th</sup>. When you make flight arrangements or any pre-trip night booking with Worldwide Quest, your transfer from the airport to our group hotel on arrival is included. If you are making your own flight or pre-trip hotel arrangements, this transfer can be provided at additional cost. The tour concludes with a single complimentary transfer from the hotel to the airport on October 23rd. Please contact us to verify timing of this transfer prior to making any flight arrangements

## **Level of Activity: Moderate**

A good level of fitness is important for this trip. You must be comfortable walking on uneven terrain and irregular paving and climbing stairs. You should be comfortable walking for up to two hours at a stretch, unassisted.

### Accommodation

The Albergo Alma Domus is owned by the church and is still home to several Dominican nuns. Set in a historic building dating from the 1300s, this traditional convent hotel with arches and columns is a 10-minute walk from the medieval square of Piazza del Campo. As with all historic buildings, guest rooms vary in size and décor. All rooms have private bathrooms. Free Wi-Fi. Amazing views over the city centre.

The Hotel Loggiato Dei Serviti is a Renaissance period residence facing Brunelleschi's Spedale degli Innocenti, a 10-minute walk from the Cathedral. Elegant rooms have private bathrooms and period furniture. Free WiFi.

## **Transportation**

We will be in a comfortable air-conditioned vehicle driven by a professional driver.

### Weather

Mid-October is a lovely time to be in Tuscany. We expect clear, sunny skies with temperatures around 22°C during the day, dropping to lows of 12°C at night.

### **Travel Documents**

You will require a passport for this trip. Please ensure it is valid for at least 3 months beyond your scheduled return home. Visas are not currently required for Canadian passport holders.
